There are currently 140 students enrolled in the school. The school is a family-focused community where each person is valued and respected in a safe and caring environment. The school has recently implemented RULER for the teaching of social and emotional learning and believes that developing students' skills in better understanding theirs and others' emotions and then acting accordingly is going to be essential for students continued development into the future. Our philosophy is based on the premise that all children can learn. Our teaching, programming and assessment practices reflect this understanding. The school promotes whole school programs including iMaths, Talk for Writing and Synthetic Phonics programs (Letters & Sounds, MultiLit and Soundwaves). The Mercy values of forgiveness, courage, service, justice, compassion, respect, determination, and excellence are brought to life in the school through the Making Jesus Real framework. - Demonstrate excellent classroom management and organisational skills that create a supportive and safe environment.
- Understands the importance of developing positive relationships with children, staff and parents and can demonstrate evidence of such actions.
- Have a sense of humour.
- Early years training would also be of consideration.

Qualifications

- Relevant 4-year tertiary qualification.
- Hold or be working towards Accreditation to Teach Religious Education.
